Code of Professional Conduct in Relation to Immigration Practitioners

1	The Forum of Immigration Practitioners of South Africa (FIPSA) has identified skills (education), integrity and excellence as the pre-eminent professional attributes of Immigration Practitioners (hereafter referred to as 'members') in South Africa. FIPSA is committed, in the interests of the immigration profession and South Africa as a whole, to enhancing these qualities in all members b providing appropriate guidance.	
	A member of FIPSA is required to comply with the following fundamental principles	
	Integrity	A professional immigration practitioner should conduct him or herself with Integrity and dignity and act in an ethical manner at all times in all professional and business relationships.
	Objectivity	A member should not allow bias, conflict of interest or undue influence of others to override professional or business judgments. He should be able and willing to deal fairly with clients
2	Professional Competence and Due Care	A member has a continuing duty to maintain professional knowledge and skill at the level required to ensure that a client or employer receives competent professional service based on current developments in practice, legislation and techniques. A member should act diligently and honestly in accordance with applicable technical and professional standards when providing professional services.
	Confidentiality	A member must respect the confidentiality of information acquired as a result of professional and business relationships and should not disclose any such information to third parties without proper and specific authority unless there is a lega or professional right or duty to disclose. Confidential information acquired as a result of professional and business relationships should not be used for the personal advantage of the professional immigration practitioner or third parties
	Professional Behavior	A member should comply with relevant laws and regulations and should avoid any action that discredits FIPSA.
3	A member must ensure that his or her actions comply with all laws and regulations and owes a contractual duty to the client to act with the requisite degree of skill and care, and the contractual relationship should therefore be governed by a letter of engagement. The member also has duties to the country, notably of compliance with the law and the honest presentation of an immigration client's affairs.	
4	It is the immigration practitioner's duty to ensure that submissions made to the immigration authorities are correct and complete	
5	A member is to refrain from making statements or encouraging the making of statements in support of an application, believing or knowing such statements to be misleading, inaccurate or false.	
6	Where a member becomes aware that irregularities have occurred in relation to a client's immigration affairs, he should advise the client of the consequences, and the manner of disclosure.	
7	Where a client refuses to follow the advice of a member in relation to issues involving disclosure, the member should consider whether he should continue the engagement.	
8	A member shall be honest about the prospects of success when assessing a request for assistance, preparing a case or submitting an application.	
9	Members shall not encourage the lodging of applications which will not succeed and within reason ensure that the client understands the situation	
10	When approached for information on a client's affairs by another member or Immigration Professional, the member should ensure that he has his client's authority before making any disclosure	
11	The Code is established on the basis that unless a limitation is specifically stated, the Code is equally valid for all members, whether in public practice, commerce, business, public sector or academia.
